

PATRONS PROVIDE FOR, AND PROTECT INVESTMENTS

District patrons historically have protected their neighborhood schools by authorizing bonds for renovations and maintainance of existing schools and for new school construction. Peoria Unified is grateful for voter support of overrides as well, which fund day-to-day operations across the district.

Due to reduced state capital funding, school districts have been forced to turn to bond monies for building maintenance and repair over the past seven years.

In April 2016, Peoria Unified Governing Board members authorized a \$198 million bond election, which if approved, will fund repairs to all school buildings, renovate high school performing arts centers, purchase land and construction for new schools, and update technology and infrastructure throughout the district. The 2012 bond can not be used for land purchase or new building construction, it has funded renovations to schools such as new roofs and floors. 

High school students are afforded the opportunity to earn college credits while taking qualifying courses at reduced tuition from Grand Canyon University or the 12 colleges in the Maricopa County Community College District. Dual enrollment credits are transferrable within state public universities. Courses include biology, business, chemistry, child and family studies, education, English humanities, history, mathematics, physics, political science, sign language and world languages.

Planning for a career or college starts as early as kindergarten in Peoria Unified. Our award-winning career development planning program — MyLife — provides age-appropriate opportunities for students within each grade level to make natural connections to college and careers. Research shows that when students have a career goal in mind, they are more focused in school.

Technology, Life, Careers (TLC) is the first level of Career and Technical Education in Peoria Unified. Seventh and eighth-grade students have the opportunity to learn about career fields and national career clusters available to them in high school.
