**Block Scheduling:** Our students attend four 90-minute classes per day. Students may earn 4 credits each semester to total 8 credits in a school year. Some classes are scheduled year-long and are worth a total of 2 credits at the end of the school year. **Credits:** Students are awarded credits at the end of each semester. Unless the class is a 9-week term/quarter class, then students are given credit at the end of the 9-week grading period.

### Graduation requirement is 28 credits.

Honors/Advanced Placement/Gifted Classes: Honors classes are offered in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Humanities, Foreign Language and Computer Science. Centennial currently offers 21 Honors courses, 14 Advanced Placement courses, 2 AP Prep science courses and 4 AIM (Accelerated Integrated Model for gifted students) courses. The AIM gifted courses are the most rigorous courses offered to freshmen and sophomores. AP courses are the most rigorous courses offered to juniors and seniors. In 2019, 106 AP testers took 177 AP exams. Currently there are 300 students enrolled in 14 AP subjects for 2019-20 school year. Centennial High School students also have the opportunity to earn dual enrollment credit in 26 different subjects for the 2019-20 school year.
