October Scholarships

- **McDonald's HACER Scholarship/\$5,000-\$100,000**

Deadline- scholarship application opening in the fall

Requirements: 1. You're a high school senior 2. You're a legal U.S. resident or a DREAMer/DACA recipient 3. You're younger than 21 years old 4. You carry a minimum 2.8 GPA 5. You're eligible to attend a two- or four-year college or university with a full-time course of study 6. You'll disclose other scholarship programs that you've applied for 7. You'll enroll and attend an accredited institution in the academic year after your selection (verification needed, as scholarship funds are paid directly to the schools) 8. You have at least one parent of Hispanic heritage

- **Lounge Lizard Web Design Scholarship/ \$1,000**

Deadlines- Fall: October 3, Spring: February 19

Grade Level- seniors, undergraduates

Requirements: 1. Applicant must be a student at an accredited school or be accepted to begin school at an accredited school within 6 months of application. 2. Must complete application including link to web design and unofficial transcript

- **Breaking Barriers Student Athlete Scholarship/ \$3,000**

Deadline- November 14

Grade Level- seniors

Requirements: 1. Graduating Arizona high school senior 2. Current athlete in an organized sporting team (e.g., high school, local public or private club, recreational league or other formal organizations) 3. Plans to attend an Arizona college or university 4. 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA 5. Membership with Desert Financial Credit Union is not required 6. Demonstrated financial need

- **Arizona School Counselor Association Scholarship/ \$1,000**

Deadline- December 2

Grade Level- Seniors

Requirements: 1. Must be a permanent resident of the state of Arizona 2. Must plan to attend a post-secondary education institution following graduation 3. Must have a school counselor employed by the district that is a member of AzSCA

- **Young Arts/ up to \$10,000**

Deadline- October 17

Grade Level- Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors

Requirements: Must be able to answer yes to the following: 1. I am either a citizen of the United States, a permanent resident/green card recipient, or I can demonstrate that I am legally able to receive taxable income in the United States. 2. I am in grades 10–12 or 15–18 years of age on December 1 of the year I am applying. 3. If I'm selected as an award winner with distinction, this would be my first time attending National YoungArts Week.

- **Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship**

Deadline- January 9

Grade Level- Seniors

Requirements: 1. Must be a U.S. citizen 2. Must have financial need 3. Must demonstrate academic excellence 4. Must demonstrate leadership potential and a dedication to community service 5. Plan to attend an accredited and approved 4-year college in the US 6. Have not accrued more than 25% of credits needed to graduate from college

- **The LAGRANT Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship/ \$2,500**

Deadline- January 15 (preferred deadline), February 28 5:00 PM (final deadline)

Grade Level- Undergraduate students

Requirements: 1. Must be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident or DACA recipient 2. Must be a member of one of the following ethnic groups: African American/Black, Asian American/Pacific Islander, Hispanic/Latino or Native American/American Indian 4. Must be a full-time student at a four-year, accredited institution in the U.S., carrying a total of 12 units or more per semester/quarter 5. *Must have a minimum of 3.0 GPA 6. Must major in a field of study that has an emphasis in advertising, marketing, public relations 7. MUST have AT LEAST ONE YEAR to complete his/her degree from the time the scholarships are awarded in May 2025 8. Recipients MUST be available to participate in the scholarship activities in May 2025. If chosen, the applicant MUST attend TLF's scholarship activities as noted at top of page to receive the scholarship. The applicant must make a one-year commitment to maintain contact with TLF to receive professional guidance and academic support

- **ITE Diversity Scholars Program/ \$4,000 per year, up to \$20,000 total**

Application Opens - Oct Deadline- March 15

Grade Level- high school or community college student

Requirements: 1. United States high school or community college student of African American; Native American, Alaskan, and Hawaiian; or Hispanic/Latino heritage 2. United States citizen or lawful permanent resident of the United States 3. Intended or declared major in transportation engineering, planning, or a related field 4. Full-time enrollment or intended enrollment at an accredited college or university with an [ITE student chapter](#) 5. Good academic standing, Minimum high school grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) 6. Additional preferences: First generation college student (neither parent received a baccalaureate degree), Low household income - applicants that are eligible for Pell Grants will be given priority, but those not eligible for Pell Grants will still be considered.

- **Flinn Scholarship/ over \$130,000**

Deadline- October 21

Grade Level- Seniors

Requirements: 1. Three essay questions and two short-answer questions; 300-word maximum per essay question 2. Two Letters of Recommendation 3. a report from your high school's academic counselor, submitted separately by your counselor (and, at the option of that academic counselor, a recommendation if he or she knows you well enough to provide one 4.

Transcript 5. ACT/SAT Scores
