Discussion of funds and current November updates were discussed with a reported potential increase of funds in the M& O and Capital budget funds. There is some unclarity in the provided reports. Foothills will focus on the minimal not the max in a way to ensure we are not over using money. There was an outline of the Title I funds and the increase of the money that was done in late September and reflected the additions in the Title I fund areas.

Discussion of Title I funds in areas as a general sense as of a need for a quick change in the additions of funds. There is a not a specific amount budgeted with these changes. There will be more decisions to be made by the initiative team and there will be an opportunity to use money effectively and move funds to other allocated areas of need.

In the next meeting a fund review of tax credit money will be provided to the council and will highlight the areas of focus.

AGENDA ITEMS

• <u>School Discipline Report and</u> Discussion Reviewed updated data on referrals for the school year. Comparing data from 2017-18 and 2018-19 from August to October and October to November. Discussed what were other "violations of School policy".

Bond Override Discussion

We discussed the outcomes of the Carrol voting area that represents the Foothills community. A list of yes and no votes in the areas were provided (with an unclear map). Past reports were in the high 60's to mid-70's in percentage of in favor of the bond and override elections in the past. Discussion of some of the impacts that could happen with some rumors of schools being closed. Discussion of why this could happen

with enrollment, age of school, locations. Talk of upper Peoria with open enrollment and schools not accepting open enrollment. Also continued some conversation of safety priorities and potential fencing around a campus. It was communicated that there has not been an update as of yet, but something expected about these safety priorities this month before the break. Some brief conversation about need and discussion of the safety in terms of physical environment or other needs such as behavioral. Small explanation of the Foothills / PUSD protocol for threat management and suicide prevention.

Safety Updates

Discussed the new concept of the emergency whistle that all staff have. This purchase was one that was built on the reality of communication in crisis situations and some teacher ideas that come to the action we took. Also discussed the completion of the EOP team and their planned responsibilities. The ADE training was brought up and that staff were not attending. There was no knowledge of the district attending the ADE meeting. There was discussion of the suicide prevention training the principal is attending that week.

• Be Kind Program

Referring back to the discipline and some of the safety discussion, the Be Kind program is work that Assistant principal, Alison Shinkle, is working on. There was some basic information page provided and a video of the "energy" of the program and the commitment concepts. There was discussion of the dance part and the arts-based campus. There was discussion of age groups involved and we were unsure of the limitations. There was discussion of other programs we had done about bullying in the past, but this program has changed the idea of "anti-bullying" to having a focus on a kindness and giving to others mindset for children.

The Site Council members conducted a vote. 5 of 5 members approved the use of the Tax Credit funds for this program and potential resources to make more of a consistent impact. The funds approved would not be more than \$3000.

• Makerspace Tour and Updates

At the end of the meeting, we toured the updated Makerspace. We discussed some programs we are starting. (deconstruction therapy for behavior and Cigar Box Guitar construction/mentoring program). Discussed some other ideas with the tools and materials we have... Robotics, STEM, sewing, etc. Knowing the potential is about project base learning in h classroom and the use of Makerspace for afterschool programs and 21st Century grant opportunities.

 Further discussion on bullet points Brief discussion of monitoring the success of programs approved by the Site Council.

• Future agenda items

Based on further discussion, Site Council will develop a student and staff survey for the Be Kind program for after the presentation and the end of the school year. We will also discuss communication to our families about the program and other impactful connections.


