- \*Mask


\*Calculator - See the permitted calculator list

Glendale Community College is one of our closest community colleges. The advantage to attending a community college is that you can live at home while in college, smaller class sizes, and the cost is \$85 a credit. (ASU is about \$900 a credit). Representatives from The In-State Universities are also available at GCC to assist you with class coordination for transferring to the university.
