Don't be Afraid of the FAFSA!!!

Filing the FAFSA is the first step to finding money for college.

Receive free assistance with the application process in this virtual FAFSA Lab (hosted via TEAMS).

To complete the FAFSA application, you will need:

- Social Security Number or Alien Registration Number*
- 2019 federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned (e.g., IRS 1040, 1040EZ, etc.)
- Records of investments, veterans' benefits, and/or untaxed income (if applicable)
- Parents' information (if applicable): Parents' date of birth Month and year of marriage/divorce
- A Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) to electronically sign your FAFSA.
 (If you do not already have one, visit www.fsaid.ed.gov to obtain one.)
