

### Career Connection:

## Statistician

Statisticians practice the science of using data to make decisions. They decide what data they need and how to collect it, design experiments, collect data, analyze and interpret data, and report conclusions. And unlike most professions, statistics can be applied to a vast number of fields or issues, like the environment, public safety, health care and sports.

A bachelor's degree is required in statistics which may include courses such as linear algebra, calculus, experimental design, survey methodology, probability, and statistical theory. Most companies require a master's degree in statistics or math. Some employers may consider a bachelor's degree but would certainly want extensive experience and knowledge in this occupation prior to working. Masters degree usually includes mathematics, economics, computer science, or other quantitative field classes.



## Graduation Rate

When you're considering what college to attend, one qualification will always come up: graduation rate. Graduation rate refers to the time in which a student enters and then completes a degree at a 4-year college or university, usually expressed as a percentage: X% of enrolled students complete their degree in four years. We can find these rates listed on many national rankings. The interpretation is fairly simple; a high number is good, a low number is something to review further with the college of interest.
