**Chandler/Gilbert Community College:** This college is part of the Maricopa Community Colleges and offers the Honors' Scholarship of Free Tuition for students who have a GPA of 3.25 or above. #### Speech-Language Pathologist

Speech-language pathologists work with people who have difficulty speaking or swallowing. Their work involves evaluating patients for articulation, language or other problems and then prescribing a course of treatment. Also called speech therapists, speech-language pathologists usually need a graduate degree. The Median Salary for this position is around \$77,510.00 annually.

# **Terms to Learn**

#### **Award Letter**

A financial aid award letter is the notification that students receive informing them how much financial aid a school is willing to offer.

All students that submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), were approved for aid and accepted by a school will receive a financial aid award letter from that school. You may find that this notice is referred to by names such as "financial aid offer," "FAFSA award letter," or "financial aid package," but they are all basically the same

An award letter is often received around the same time as college acceptance letters. This can vary depending upon the timing of your FAFSA submission and each school's administrative process. Financial aid award letters are only for one year of school. You'll need to complete the FAFSA every year to determine what aid you are eligible for and you'll receive a new award letter every year with that FAFSA submission.
