# Ways that you can help your child with homework #3

# Provide Supplies and Identify Resources

Have available pencils, pens, erasers, writing paper and a dictionary. Other supplies that might be helpful include a stapler, paper clips, maps, a calculator, a pencil sharpener, tape, glue, paste, scissors, a ruler, a calculator, index cards, a thesaurus and an almanac. If possible, keep these items together in one place. If you can't provide your child with needed supplies, check with her teacher, school guidance counselor or principal about possible sources of assistance.

For books and other information resources, such as suitable computer Web sites, check with the school library or your local public library. Some libraries have homework centers designed especially to assist children with school assignments (they may even have tutors and other kinds of individual assistance).

You may want to ask your child's teacher to explain school policy about the use of computers for homework. Certainly, computers are great learning and homework tools. Your child can use her computer not only for writing reports and for getting information through Internet resource sites, but for "talking" with teachers and classmates about assignments. In many schools, teachers post information about homework assignments and class work on their own Web sites, which also may have an electronic bulletin board on which students can post questions for the teacher and others to answer. (For more information about using the Internet, see the U.S. Department of Education's booklet, Parents' Guide to the Internet, listed in the Resources section, page .) However, you don't have to have a computer in your home for your child to complete homework assignments successfully. Some schools may offer after-school programs that allow your child to use the school computers. And many public libraries make computers available to children.

- Compassion is the emotion of purple and to other living things. Compassion gives a person an emotional bond with his or her world.
- 3. Respect is similar to compassion but different in some ways. Whereas compassion is directed toward other people or living things, an important aspect of respect is self-respect. In addition, respect is also directed toward inanimate things or ideas, as well as toward other people and/or living creatures. For example, people should have respect for laws. Finally, respect includes the idea of esteem or admiration, whereas compassion is a feeling people can have for others they don't necessarily admire.
- 4. Responsibility is created by honesty, compassion and respect which includes both private, personal and public responsibility. All individuals and groups have responsibilities. Responsibility is about action, and it includes much of what people think of as good citizenship. One of the main responsibilities of students is to learn. They must educate themselves so that they can live up to their full potential.
- 5. Courage is important to good citizenship. Human beings are capable of moving beyond mere goodness toward greatness. Courage enables people to do the right thing even when it's unpopular, difficult, or dangerous. Many people— including Ben Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, Martin Luther King Jr., Susan B. Anthony, and Mahatma Gandhi had the courage to change the rules to achieve justice.

# FREE & REDUCED LUNCH

A new application must be filled out every school year. An application will be sent home with every student the first day of school. Only one application is needed per family, even if the students go to different schools.

Applications will also be made available on the district website prior to the start of the school year.

### **Meal Prices**

Free - no cost at breakfast or lunch Reduced - Breakfast \$0.30, Lunch \$0.40 Peoria Unified Schools participate in the Child Nutrition Program. The program is a federally subsidized program and your children may be eligible to receive free or reduced-priced breakfast and lunch. If you wish to apply for the free or reduced-price meal program, please obtain an application from the school office or district office.

### **Application Review Timeframes**

Online applications take approximately 3-4 days to process. Paper applications take approximately 10 days to process. The District's Food & Nutrition Department will send a letter to notify applicants of the approval or denial of their application.

### Changes in Income

If your children receive free or reduced-price meals based on income information, you must inform the school cafeteria manager when your household size decreases or your income increases by more than \$50 per month (\$600 per year). If your child receives free meals based on information from Food Stamp, Cash Assistance or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, you must inform the school cafeteria manager if you no longer receive these benefits.

### Verification

Your eligibility may be verified by school officials at any time during the school year. You may be asked to send information to prove that your child should receive free or reduced-price meals.

# Confidentiality

The application information will be used to allow your student to receive free or reduced-price meals. However, this information may also be used to determine eligibility for other benefits. If you want to waive your rights to confidentiality to be considered for other benefits, carefully read the "Limited Confidentiality Waiver" at the bottom of the application.

# Nondiscrimination

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) prohibits discrimination in all its programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, gender, age, and/or disability.

Students are not identified in any way if they are receiving free or reduced-price meals.

# SCHOOL LUNCHES

## Breakfast & Lunch Prices

Breakfast includes a choice of hot entree or breakfast kit, fruit & 100% fruit juice and a choice of white or chocolate milk. Meal price is \$1.50, reduced price 30-cents.

Lunch includes a choice from 2 hot and 1 cold lunch entrees, fruit & vegetable bar, choice of white, chocolate or strawberry milk. Meal price is \$2.50, reduced price 40-cents.

# How to Sign Up for an Online Account

Your child does not need to carry lunch money to school with them every day. You can set up an online account that will electronically debit cafeteria meals. <u>MySchoolBucks.com</u> is a safe, secure, accurate and convenient way to pay for meals. When you set up an account online, you can choose to add payments manually or opt-out for automatic withdrawals. \$2.49 is charged for each transaction. At breakfast or lunch, elementary school students enter a pin number to debit their MyLunchMoney.com meal account. <u>http://www.SchoolLunchApp.com</u>
