#### **Paperless Progress Reports**

#### **New! Text Message Alerts from Centennial**

We know that communicating with you about your child's education is essential and this school year, we will be using text messaging as an additional option to periodically share school updates and district news with you. Families must opt-in in order to receive text message updates from Centennial. To opt in, simply **text the word "yes" to 67587** and you should receive a confirmation text shortly thereafter. ## **Parking Passes Still Available**

Because the schoolwide demand for parking spaces typically exceeds the number of available spots, any remaining seniors who wish to purchase parking passes should do so as soon as possible. Even seniors learning virtually, who expect to learn on-campus during second semester, may wish to consider purchasing their pass now. In the event of a significant school closure, our district's business services office will issue partial refunds based upon the length of the closure. #### **Tuesday: Special Schedule for Senior ACT Makeup**

Because of last spring's COVID closure, our seniors missed the traditional opportunity to take the ACT. We're pleased to offer our seniors the chance to take the ACT on Tuesday, October 20<sup>th</sup>. Morning bus routes for senior test takers will run according to their normal times. Testing will begin at 7:20am, and seniors must arrive on time, with a picture ID. Late students will not be admitted into testing rooms. Testing rooms will be limited to 15 students, and masks are mandatory for testers and staff. <u>Click here for more information about the ACT</u>.

All non-testing students in Grades 9-10-11 will have a late start schedule on October 20<sup>th</sup>. Buses will pick up students at bus stops exactly 4 hours and 35 minutes after the regular pick up time and arrive at Centennial at or near 11:35am.

## **Attendance for In-Person Learners**

Students who chose in-person, classroom instruction must physically attend school to receive credit for daily attendance. Parents, please remember to call our attendance office to verify any absences due to illness, doctor's appointments, or other obligations. Classroom learners who choose to engage in virtual learning from home must still be marked absent. Only students registered as virtual learners can be marked present for engaging virtually. There is an exception: If our school nurse requires a classroom learner to isolate or quarantine, that classroom learner may receive daily attendance credit for engaging virtually from home. Please contact our school nurse if your classroom learner exhibits COVID-like symptoms or has been potentially exposed to an individual who has tested positive for COVID. As they have all year, home learners must engage virtually each day, with each of their classes, to receive credit for attendance.

## An Important Review of Safety Protocols

Our district shared that last week's COVID-19 data indicators slightly increased. On Monday afternoon, we sent an email to our entire community regarding a potential on-campus exposure. These communications naturally concern many of our families, students, and staff members.

#### When a COVID Diagnosis is Confirmed:

Anytime we become aware of a positive COVID diagnosis, we alert the Maricopa County Health Department and notify our staff and community. We then determine and directly speak to any close contacts who must quarantine. Our district utilizes an electrostatic sprayer to completely disinfect any campus areas related to the diagnosis, prior to our students returning.

#### **Daily Campus Protocols:**

Daily, we require all students and staff to wear masks. We continue to encourage one-way foot traffic during passing periods, to stock dozens of hand-sanitizing stations, and to disinfect surfaces. Out of an abundance of caution, our nurse assigns ten-day home isolation to students who exhibit COVID-like symptoms and requires a 14-day quarantine for any students exposed to COVID-positive individuals.

#### Daily Student, Staff, and Visitor Protocols:

Please regularly engage your Coyote in conversations about the protocols that promote safety:

Stay Home if You Feel III Screen Each Morning for COVID-like Symptoms Check Your Temperature Before School Regularly Wash and Sanitize Your Hands

Wear Your Mask, Covering Your Nose and Mouth Socially Distance Where Possible Report Positive COVID tests to the Nurse (623-412-4408)
