Timeline and Deadlines:
 Seniors should begin applying to college in the fall semester. Many schools have priority deadlines in November and December in order to be considered for certain scholarships. Some highly prestigious schools offer the option of "Early Decision" (binding) or "Early Action" (non-binding) to be considered for admission in a smaller pool. We strongly advise students to review these options with their family and counselor to make sure it's a good choice. 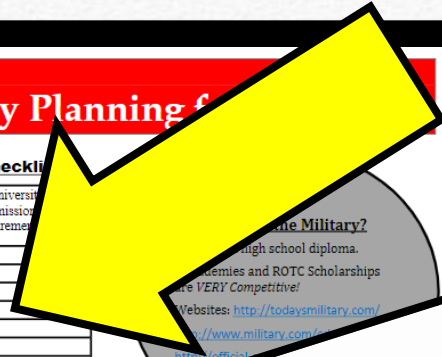

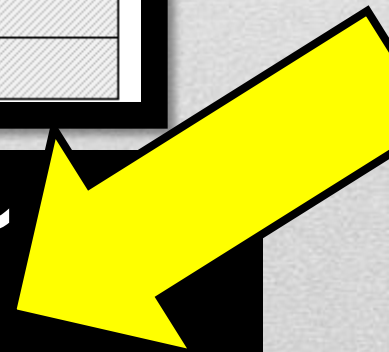
