All off-campus programs require an additional application that the student must submit to their Counselor to begin the process of trying to get into the program.



Some of the programs offer dual enrollment opportunities and partnerships with working professionals to prepare students for post-secondary education and careers in the STEM fields. Students attend LHS for their core classes and go to MET for their elective classes. Programs are offered in AM and PM and transportation both ways may be provided. Students apply online on the PUSD MET homepage and submit the completed/signed application to their Counselor. Applying does not guarantee a spot in the program and students are usually notified in January if they are accepted.

## West-MEC

WWW.WEST-MEC.ORG West-Mec programs are available to all PUSD students who would like to take classes to prepare for a specific occupation or trade, typically during their junior and/or senior years. Some programs are one-year, but most are two-year. West-MEC has multiple campuses located in proximity to PUSD schools, but *all transportation is the responsibility of the student and parent*.
