SENIOR TO-DO LIST:

Don't know what you want to do after High School?

- $\hfill\square$ Sign-up for the ASVAB test in February in the Career Center
- □ Utilize Major Clarity website to take career and personality tests. There are directions online in Teams under the Files tab to log-in

If pursuing Military Enlistment:

- □ Meet with recruiter; see Career Center for recruiting schedule and contacts
- $\hfill\square$ Sign-up to take the ASVAB test in the Career Center
- College/military check with University about ROTC programs and Scholarships

If pursuing Community College:

- □ <u>2</u>^{-d} Take placement test at CC Admissions and Testing Office; no appt. needed; see their website for testing times
- □ <u>3</u>⁻⁻ Register for classes; the 2022-23 schedule should be out in March '22 at the Community Colleges; freshman should register with an advisor on campus
- □ Request transcripts as part of Senior check-out process in May

If pursuing University Admission:

- Register for ACT/SAT (*if needed*) <u>as soon as possible</u>! Refer to their websites for testing dates and online registration as you register through them directly
- □ Check out the Tri-University online sessions a great way to get information from all 3 in-state Universities on variety of topics (see Teams for links)
- $\hfill\square$ Visit or tour the College/Univ/Tech School campus
- □ Apply early! You can do this on-line at the University's Admission link. It is *best to apply early* (by October 1st so they have all necessary information by 12/1 preferred deadline when they award academic scholarships for incoming freshmen)
- □ Register for NCAA/NAIA if pursuing College Sports. It is recommended to talk to your coaches/counselor first
- □ Request transcripts as needed <u>or</u> as part of Senior check-out in May

Need Financial Aid?

- □ Create a resume & start a letter of recommendation file
- □ Check PUSD Scholarship Database you should be doing this weekly!
- □ Apply, apply, apply for Scholarships! You should be actively researching and applying for scholarships early and often. The college or University you are going to usually will have an entire website that you can apply for scholarships through them after you are admitted. Another reason to APPLY ONLINE EARLY for admissions.
- FAFSA for Grants and Loans! You must complete the FAFSA application online at <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u> in October <u>using your parents' taxes from last</u> <u>year</u>. The FAFSA Application is <u>required</u> for most Financial Aid Departments on University & CC Campuses, <u>even if you wish to decline</u> <u>Student Loans</u>.
