

When you register online for an exam, you can choose your test site. Centennial is not an ACT test location but there are schools nearby who do offer it. Use the following information to plan your testing for the 20-21 school year.

Exam Fees: (check the ACT website for more information about fees)

The ACT (no writing)	\$55.00	Includes reports for you, your high school, and up to four colleges (if codes are provided when you register).
The ACT with writing	\$78.00	Includes reports for you, your high school, and up to four colleges (if codes are provided when you register).

Fee waivers are available through your School Counselor and the Guidance Office—you must be eligible for free/reduced lunch through the National Student Lunch Program. A fee waiver allows you to take the exam for free. You are allowed only 1 exam per waiver. Apply for free/reduced lunch at: www.peoria.schoollunchapp.com You can check here to see if your family meets the eligibility guidelines: https://www.fns.usda.gov/school-meals/income-eligibility-guidelines.

If you are eligible for and use a *fee waiver*, the ACT waiver will give you an unlimited use to try and get application fees waived to college. It can be sent but not all colleges honor it. Applying to college is an expensive process, with fees ranging from \$25 to \$100 per application (depending on the school). More information is on the ACT Fee Waiver.

Test Prep Opportunities:

- Apps download on your Smart Phone (some are free, others have a fee)
- Paper/Book You get a test booklet and you can look for other helps in bookstores and online. Make sure it is for the current ACT.
- **ACT Academy** go to http://academy.act.org/ This online academy is free of charge to help you prepare for the test.
- **Test Prep Organizations (online or in person tutoring)** Princeton Review offers test prep courses and classes, Sylvan Learning Center, etc. (there can be a cost to this option).
- **Study Groups** you form them with your friends, determine what you want to study and help each other solve problems
