Earning College Credit in High School

Dual Enrollment

Courses offered through the Maricopa Community College District

MCCD charges our students a reduced rate (currently \$72 per credit hour)

Pass the class with a "C" or better to earn the college credit

Information given to the students the first week of class

Credit transfers to our in-state universities

AP Tests

Prep for AP tests during AP classes

Tests are given in May

Cost - approximately \$100 per test


Passing grade - 3, 4, or a 5
