## Scholarship Search



Finding money for school after high school is one of the most important things you can do as a high school student. The sooner you start, the more money you may be eligible for. Today we would like you to research some scholarships and actually apply for one!

## Student Vue

-Open up a tab and log into Student Vue.

-On the right hand side, on the very bottom, click on High School Student Resources.

-From there click on Scholarship Eligibility.

-From here you can see a long list of scholarships that you may be eligible for.

-First you should go up to the top and Edit Profile. This will help narrow down the scholarships to ones that apply to you specifically.

-Go back to the scholarship list and click on a scholarship that may be interesting to you. Fill in the information below about that scholarship. You may have to click on the link to get more information. If you find one you want to apply for, do it right now!!:

## College Depot

Another great scholarship search site is College Depot which is an organization through the Phoenix Public Libraries.

## College Board Opportunity Scholarships

A new scholarship program for all students that guides you through the college planning process.

The more effort you put in, the more opportunities you have to earn a scholarship. Complete all six, and you're eligible to earn \$40,000. Scholarships will be awarded through monthly drawings to students who complete each action. In order to begin the process for this scholarship you need to create a College Board account. You can do that now if you are interested working on this scholarship. Click on the yellow box 'Earn Scholarships' to get started.



Earn micro-scholarships from college for your achievements as early as 9<sup>th</sup> grade. This site gives you scholarship money for things you are doing anyway. You would make an account, fill in your grades and activities and certain schools will give you money. Not every school participates so check on your schools. If you already have a RaiseMe account you can update it now.

-Head to raise.me

-Click on 'Students' from the top menu and click on High School Students

-Click 'Sign Up' to make an account

-Once you have an account you can view the schools that participate. The schools from Arizona that participate are ASU, UofA, Prescott College, Embry Riddle. Check to see if there are any schools that you are interested in.
