# What does a 4 or 5 score replace?

University of Arizona:

Environmental Science 4 or 5 score counts as T2 Natural Sciences or T1 GEOS 170 OR\* Elective credit 3 units

Arizona State University:

Environmental Science 5 or 4 score is 3 credits in SOS 110

Environmental Science 4 or 5 counts as ENV 101 and 101L for 4 credits

## What about grades?

*Tests and other assessments*. The tests alternate between multiple choice tests and free response tests, essay exams.

small quizzes. These quizzes will happen at least twice a week. They will not be cumulative, but on the previous class's materials. I apologize that you will be annoyed by them but they will encourage you to study regularly.

Big Idea Questions/ Group work- The big idea questions will take a multitude of current day topics with content form the various lessons. The students will need to create solutions to the problems with a tiered step process in their approach, for example a ten-year plan.

You usually will not receive written homework. You are expected to review your notes and keep up on the reading. Do not fall behind. Material in the reading not mentioned in class is still fair game for assessments. Sometimes you may be asked to research materials for a topic.

Please keep on the reading, it will improve your score on the AP Exam. Rocking this class and skipping the book will generally lead to a 3/5 on the AP Exam. Reading the text improves your ability to get a 5/5. *Silent Spring* and *A Sand County Almanac* are great additions for any student wanting to improve their knowledge in Environmental Science. It will add knowledge for the free response questions.

# What about notes?

You will need a separate binder for this class. Note taking will be required. Some people can learn without taking notes, but they still learn better if they take notes.

As far as fidgety stuff. Doodling in your notes is fine. Please don't bring in other homework, do reading for this class or others, knit or crochet.

Hand-write your notes, you may not use your computer for note taking. You will need a calculator, phones cannot be used for calculators. They are allowed on the test this year.

# What if notes go too fast?

We have to get in one year's content in a little over 15 weeks the pace will be fast at first, but it is college pace. I will post notes online after each class. If you miss part of a slide, I recommend leaving some blank lines in your notebook, marking it with a symbol, and finding the missing information through a classmate. Your notes will not be graded by me, they are to help you learn.

### How do I take notes?

Your lectures are college level. The slides in the presentations provide major points in the content, but you will have to add additional detail as you follow along. Copying what is on each slide will not prepare your for the tests, make certain you copy other details mentioned by the teacher. The best way to do this is to focus on what I say and not copying each slide down as it appears.
