AP Euro Objectives:

- Study political, economic, and social/cultural history of Europe and its impact on the world. (1450 – ___)
- Analyze primary source documents [DBQ]
 - Creating a written argument using these sources
- Argumentation [LEQ]
 - Creating an argument through historical knowledge learned in class
- Multiple Choice
 - Skills and test-taking strategies
 - Primary & Secondary source Reading Comprehension
 - Maps, charts, & graphs comprehension

AP Euro exam:

▪ Multiple Choice

- 55 minutes for 55 questions
- 40% of score

▪ Short Answer

- 40 minutes for 3 questions
- 20% of score

▪ Document Based question

- 60 minutes for 1 analysis essay
- 25% of score

▪ Long Essay question

- 40 minutes for 1 argument essay
- 15% of score

Why take the test?

- ASU – 6 credits for a score of >4 which counts for HST 103 & 104
 - \$94 test = (\$358 per credit X 6) = \$2,148
- NAU – 6 credits for a score of >4 which counts for HIS 240 & 241
 - \$94 test = (\$224 per credit X 6) = \$1,344
- UofA – 6 credits for a score of >4 which counts for HIST 160B1 or Humanities & HIST 150C1 or Individuals & Societies
 - \$94 test = (\$733 per credit X 6) = \$4,398
- Grand Canyon - 6 credits for a score of >3 counts for Global Awareness, Perspectives, and Ethics
 - \$94 test = (\$395 per credit X 6) = \$2,370
- Most University of California school offer at least 3 credits for a score of >3, but per credit prices vary

Even if a student were to *fail*, **85% of colleges** would rather see you tried and took the risk than taking an AP course and not test.
