Enrolling at GCC? Here's what you need to bring:

- 1) Something to take notes with
- 2) A form of identification
 - AZ Driver's license or permit, state ID card, passport, Permanent resident card <u>OR</u>
 - High school ID AND birth certificate
- 3) Social Security Number (for federal financial aid and in-state tuition eligibility)
- 4) High school unofficial transcript

ATHLETES

If you're wanting to play sports at the next level, here are a few helpful suggestions:

- Junior year you need to register for <u>NCAA eligibility</u>, <u>NAIA eligibility</u>, or both depending on your pathway
- Make sure the classes you are taking are NCAA or NAIA approved
- Make sure you are NCAA or NAIA eligible (see eligibility below)

GRADES MATTER! If you are getting Ds in **core** classes, you may want to retake them PRIOR to senior year. Talk to your counselor about this.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- <u>NCAA</u>
- 16 core classes
- 2.33 core GPA
- <u>10/7 rule</u> 10 of 16 core
- classes completed by 7th
- semester of high school.
- Check that your courses
- are NCAA approved.

IMPORTANT!!

- Please make sure the current courses you are taking are NCAA approved.
- Any classes at Peoria Flex Academy are not NCAA approved.

You can only repeat core classes at: 1) Cactus High School (during the school year)

2) Peoria eCampus

NAIA

You must meet 2 of 3 requirements

- 18 min ACT OR 970 min SAT
- 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Graduate top 50%



COLLEGE RECRUITING

9th Grade

- Make sure you are taking all the necessary core classes
- Get to know coaches and schools you are interested in
- Work hard to keep your grades up
- Start thinking about academic and career goals work with your school counselor

10th Grade

- Keep your grades up
- Talk with your school coaches and express your desires to play at the next level
- Start building a list of colleges you would like to attend
- Play and train at the highest level possible
- Continue conversations with career goals

11th Grade

- Make sure you are on track for your core course requirements
- Realistically assess your athletic skills
- Realistically assess your academic skills
- Refine your list of colleges
- Take the ACT
- Contact each coach of the schools you would like to attend
- Register for NCAA clearing house
- Showcase your athletic talents

12th Grade

- Make sure you are on track to graduate and meet all the Division Requirements
- Update NCAA clearinghouse by sending your transcripts
- Narrow your college choice and talk with collegiate coaches
- Keep in constant contact with each school you are interested in
- Make your final decision based on costs, academics, and athletic ability

Academic Questions to Consider

- What kind of school do I qualify for academically?
- What level of athletics do I qualify for?
- What balance of academics, athletics, social life and extracurricular activities do you want?
- What size of school are you interested in?
- Small class size or large campus environment?
- What financial arrangements must be made for you given the costs of various schools?

GPA WHY IS IT SO IMPORTANT?

CORE GPA

Core GPA includes **ONLY** core classes

English - 4 credits
(English I, II, III, IV)
Math - 4 credits
(Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, 4th math class)

• **Social Studies** - 3 credits (World History, AZ/US History, Economics/Government)

• **Science** - 3 credits (Biology, Earth/Space, Chemistry, Physics, Environmental)

• Physical Education - 1 credit

• CTE or Fine Art - 1 credit

Total: 16 credits

CUMULATIVE GPA

Cumulative GPA includes ALL classes you take, core and electives

Core: 16 credits Electives: 12 credits

You can find your calculated cumulative GPA at the bottom left of your transcript. Please see your counselor if your GPA is missing. GPA Scale A = 4.0 points B = 3.0 points C = 2.0 points D = 1.0 points F = 0.0 points

Your grade point average or GPA is the sum of all your course grades throughout your high school career divided by the total number of credits.

Your CORE GPA is used for university admissions, scholarship opportunities, and merit-based awards. It is based on a 4.0 scale. Peoria Unified School District uses an unweighted GPA system.

The GPA posted on your transcript is your cumulative, not core.

Use your transcript and this <u>GPA</u> <u>calculator</u> to calculate your CORE GPA.

- Essay must be original and not previously published

WHO: Community Comadres is a local nonprofit that was founded by MIX 96.9 host Priscilla Ornelas. Community Comadres helps women develop personally and professionally through community events to feel heard, seen and safe.


