## CAREER CENTER

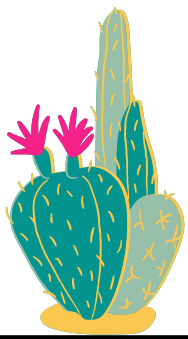

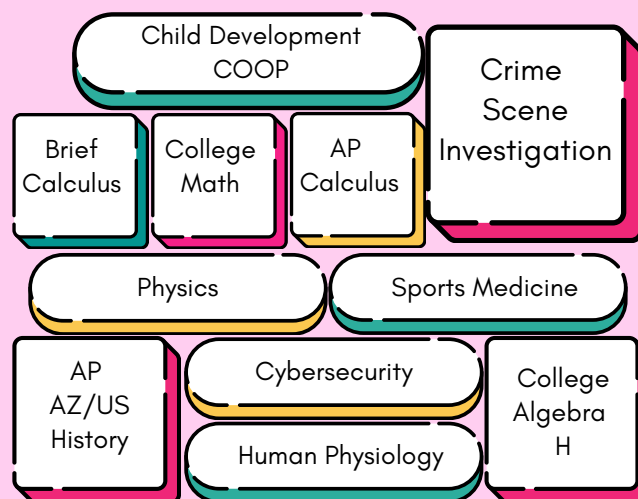
## DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual Enrollment is an excellent opportunity to earn college credit while taking high school courses. If you have a dual enrollment class in your schedule, you will also need to enroll in the Community College. In most cases, you need to get a "C" or better in the class and if you do - you will earn college credit for that class. If you take advantage of these opportunities you will graduate high school with enough college credits to be well on your way to your degree. This is an awesome opportunity to get ahead!

## **ASU's application is now open!**

We're here to announce that the Arizona State University application for fall 2025 admission is now open. ASU has launched a new application experience, and for a short time, we're limiting the number of applicants who will go through the new experience while we verify that everything is working as expected. Whether a student is routed to the new experience or the existing one, all students will be able to access the application. The Common Application opens Aug. 1.

**ASU's priority admission deadline is Nov. 1, but the earlier students apply, the sooner they'll receive their admission decision. We begin notifying students in August. Applying early also ensures that students are on track to be reviewed for merit-based scholarships when we begin awarding them later in the fall. Make sure your students fill out the FAFSA when it opens in the fall.**

The ACE (Achieving a College Education) Program is nationally recognized for its success in helping underrepresented students make smooth transitions between high school, community college and universities. GCC is accepting applications now from SOPHOMORES. This is a great opportunity experience college life and see if college is right for you.

Applications include 2 letters of recommendation, a short personal essay and a copy of your unofficial high school transcript. Essays challenge applicants to consider what challenges that they may have to overcome to be successful in high school or college? What accomplishments that they are proud of and what people or moments have shaped or inspired them. If accepted, students can earn up to 24 college credits by the time they graduate - taking classes over the summer and on Saturdays during the school year.

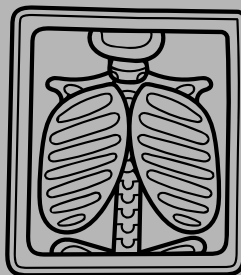

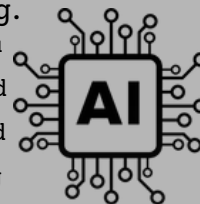
