FAFSA FAQs

- The FAFSA launches on December 1st
- High school seniors will complete the 2025-2026 FAFSA Form
- 2023 Income and Tax info is required
- Students and parents will need to create an FSA ID prior to completing the FAFSA
- Use your personal email when creating your FSA ID

FAFSA Workshops

- 11/12 and 11/15: FSA ID Workshops will be hosted in the library during English or Social Studies class. Seniors, you will need to know your <u>social security</u> number to create your FSA ID. Don't bring your card to school.
- 12/5, 12/10, 12/17: FAFSA Event for students and parents/guardians from 2:30 5:00 pm. Snacks and drinks provided.
- 1/13, 1/15, 1/22: FAFSA All Day Workshop @ CHS Library. Students can make appointments or walk in for help.

Peoria Unified School District is partnering with Billy's Place to raise awareness of childhood grief, as November 21, 2024 is Children's Grief Awareness Day.

Throughout the month, staff, parents/guardians, and students will learn about the importance of understanding and supporting childhood grief.

Your child will be given the opportunity to engage in an optional activity to show support for those who have lost a loved one on **Thursday, November 21, 2024** during lunch.

Why:

- In the US, 1 in 12 children will lose a parent or sibling by the time they reach 18.
- Our response can either serve as a source of support and stability during a difficult time or as an additional hurdle to overcome - we want our school to be a source of support.
- Children take much longer to deal with grief than we expect and they experience inner turmoil that we need to be aware of.
- We want people to learn new ways they might help a grieving child they happen to know.

PEF Scholarships

Against All Odds Scholarships are awarded to high school seniors who have overcome significant adversity to complete their high school coursework and plan to continue with post-secondary education. These remarkable young men and women face health issues, language barriers, adult responsibilities, family tragedies, and/or financial hardship with courage and fortitude.

Community Service Scholarships are awarded to select high school seniors who have demonstrated academic excellence and a strong commitment to the community in which they live. Each of the winners contributed over 60 hours of community service and plans to attend a community college or career and technical education school.

Joseph McCord Memorial Scholarships are given to deserving seniors who share Mr. McCord's passion for history, politics and giving back to the community. Mr. Joseph McCord, who served on the Peoria Unified School District Governing Board, had an affinity for history and a strong commitment to community service. His wife, Mary Lynn, and the Peoria Education Foundation established this scholarship in his honor and Mrs. McCord reviews the scholarship applicants each year.

Dr. Santarelli Leadership Scholarship is in honor of Peoria Unified's former superintendent. Dr. Santarelli served the Peoria Unified School District for 35 years as a teacher, assistant principal, principal, K-12 administrator, assistant superintendent, deputy superintendent and superintendent. He is well-known for his contributions to school improvement and is recognized across Arizona for his leadership and mentorship. This scholarship is intended for graduates who have demonstrated excellence in leadership throughout their high school career. Dr. Santarelli reviews the scholarship applicants each year.

Project Unify Scholarship is intended for Peoria Unified seniors who participated in Unified Sports activities for at least one year during school. Special consideration is given to students who plan to work with individuals with disabilities, or who plan to serve as a future educator, social worker, or other related services.

Peoria Future Farmers of America (FFA) Baskett Scholarship is intended for Peoria Unified seniors who have participated in FFA a minimum of two semesters during their high school career.



SHOW COLLEGES THAT YOU ARE READY TO SUCCEED

More and more selective schools are realizing the value of test scores and again requiring them for admissions. An ACT score can show schools that you are prepared to tackle their curriculum from day one.

WISH YOU COULD SEE YOUR ANSWERS ALONGSIDE THE CORRECT ANSWERS AFTER TAKING A TEST?

With the ACT, you can order your Test Information Release (TIR) question and answer key for three test dates a year. Learn more at act.org/tir.

THE ACT SHOWS THE RANGE OF YOUR KNOWLEDGE

Starting in 2025, the enhanced ACT will be shorter, provide you more time to respond to each question, and have three main sections - English, Math, Reading - that equally impact your score. Science and writing sections, if taken, will be reported separately and won't affect your composite score. Until then, the ACT consists of four sections - English, Math, Reading, Science - each contributing 25% of your score.

Current changes will begin in April for online and September for paper and pencil national tests.

THE ACT CAN HELP SAVE MONEY ON TUITION

Your ACT score can increase your chances of earning scholarships that can fuel your future and help with college costs. Even schools that are test optional may still require or recommend an ACT score to qualify for merit awards.

GIVE YOUR APPLICATION AN EXTRA BOOST WITH THE OPTIONAL WRITING TEST

Demonstrating your writing skills and ability to understand and explore ideas can help you stand out for competitive programs.

SKETCH OUT YOUR EDUCATIONAL AND CAREER PLANS IN MYACT OR THE ENCOURAGE APP

Narrow down <u>college majors</u> and <u>career options</u> that align with your interests. Take the <u>ACT Interest</u> <u>Inventory</u> on MyACT or quizzes within the Explore tab of the <u>Encourage app</u> to start building your future.

PUT YOUR BEST SCORE FORWARD WITH AN ACT SUPERSCORE

If you take the ACT more than once, your best subject score from each test will be used to create an official Superscore to showcase your best performance.



INTERESTED IN A STEM PROGRAM?

The ACT is the only test that includes a unique **STEM score**. If you choose to take the science section, you will receive a STEM score to measure your readiness for STEM-related majors.

ONLY THE ACT OFFERS SUPPORT FOR ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

If you are enrolled in your school's English Learners (EL) program, you may qualify for additional support when taking the ACT. Work with your school counselor to request EL accommodations after you register.

THE ACT OFFERS FEE WAIVERS FOR ELIGIBLE STUDENTS

Every student deserves the chance to chart their own course for success. If you have trouble paying for the ACT test, the ACT Fee Waiver Program can help with registration fees, test prep, and more. Check with your school counselor to find out if you are eligible to apply.
